ITINERARY DESCRIPTION

Library of Congress/Supreme Court/President Lincoln's Cottage

Trip 47

Library of Congress...Located to the rear of the Capitol Building on 1st St. There will be a 1 hr. conducted tour of the historic Jefferson Building. Learn about its history, symbolic art and architecture and the Library's history and work. There are always special exhibits. See www.loc.gov for pictures and more information.

Supreme Court Building...Located beside the Library of Congress. This building was built between 1932 and 1935. The classical Corinthian architectural style was selected because it best harmonized with nearby congressional buildings. Enjoy the many architectural features in the lobby areas. A 24 min. film will be available. See www.supremecourt.gov for pictures and more information.

Lunch...We will walk together to Union Station for lunch on your own at the food court. The bus will pick-up outside the Station.

President Lincoln's Cottage...Located in NW D. C. at the Armed Forces Retirement Home. It is operated by the National Trust for Historic Preservation. The Lincoln family lived here for over a quarter of his presidency, from June – November, 1862, '63 and '64. While living at the Cottage, Lincoln developed his Emancipation Proclamation and plotted Union wartime strategies.

Opened to the public for the first time in 2008, President Lincoln's Cottage offers guided tours that reveal Lincoln's presidency and private life – where it happened. Walking in President Lincoln's footsteps, visitors gain insight into his most influential ideas and decisions. We will have a conducted tour. Be prepared for physical security checks before entering government buildings. No sharp objects in handbags etc.

When you go to D. C. always expect considerable walking. That will be true for this trip also. Buses cannot not park close to where you are entering.
